

GRANT AMDDIFAEDED DISGYBLION / GRANT DATBLYGU DISGYBLION

Defnyddir Grant Amddifadedd gan yr ysgol i gyflogi staff cynorthwyol ychwanegol er mwyn cefnogi gwaith Llythrennedd a Rhifedd disgyblion penodol.

Ein nod yw sicrhau fod pob unigolyn yn cael budd llawn o gwricwlwm a phrofiadau cymdeithasol yr ysgol. Dyrennir y Grant Amddifadedd Disgyblion i ysgolion a disgyblion sy'n dod o deuluoedd incwm isel ac y gwyddys eu bod ar hyn o bryd yn gymwys i dderbyn prydau ysgol am ddim (FSM) adisgyblion sydd wedi derbyn gofal yn barhaus am fwy na chwe mis (LAC).

Disgwylir i ysgolion ddefnyddio'r cyllid hwn i'r eithaf i gyflwyno strategaethau cynaliadwy fydd yn arwain yn gyflym at newidiadau i ddysgwyr sy'n gymwys i dderbyn prydau ysgol am ddim neu sy'n LAC.

Fel ysgol rydym wedi cytuno ar y tri cham a ganlyn:

1. nodi'r grŵp targed o ddisgyblion, ei nodweddion a'i anghenion
2. cynllunio ymyraethau sy'n gwneud y defnydd mwyaf effeithiol o adnoddau
3. monitro a gwerthuso effaith adnoddau

Yn 2017 rhoddwyd i Ysgol Gynradd Llechryd ddyraniad Grant Amddifadedd disgyblion o £13850.

Yn Ysgol Gynradd Llechryd mae gennym gynllun sydd wedi'i gytuno a'i fonitro i hyrwyddo cynnydd a chael gwared ar rwystrau i ddysgu i fyfyrwyr sy'n gymwys ar gyfer y cyllid hwn.

Rydym wedi defnyddio'r cyllid sydd ar gael i:

- wella dysgu ac addysgu drwy ddarparu rhaglenni cefnogi yn ystod ein gwersi ac o fewn grwpiau penodol;
- darparu rhaglenni ymyrraeth megis Cyfri Ceredigion, Trandep, Satpin, Sulp a Dyfal Donc;
- darparu hyfforddiant penodol o safon uchel i staff yr ysgol ar agweddau llythrennedd a rhifedd;
- cyflwyno a defnyddio systemau olrhain data i nodi anghenion dysgwyr, targedu ymyraethau a monitro effaith;
- gweithio mewn partneriaeth ag ysgolion eraill, y gymuned a phartneriaid eraill megis Prifysgol Cymru;
- datblygu capasiti arweinyddiaeth i flaenoriaethu'r effaith ar ansawdd y ddarpariaeth a'r canlyniadau;
- cefnogi dysgwyr a'u teuluoedd drwy drefnu rhaglenni llythrennedd a rhifedd gyda chymorth.

Mae ein cynllun manwl sy'n cynnwys manylion mewn perthynas a sut rydym yn gwario'r grant ar gael o swyddfa'r ysgol. Mae'r Llywodraeth yn newid yr enw i'r grant yma i 'Grant Datblygu Disgyblion' o 2017 ymlaen.

PUPIL DEPRIVATION GRANT / PUPIL DEVELOPMENT GRANT

The Pupil Deprivation Grant is used by the school to employ support staff to help promote the Literacy and Numeracy skills of specific pupils.

We aim to ensure that individuals take full advantage of the educational and social experiences available at the school.

Ysgol Gynradd Llechryd PDG Statement:

The Pupil Deprivation Grant (PDG) is allocated to schools with pupils who come from low-income families and are currently known to be eligible for free school meals (FSM) and pupils who have been looked after continuously for more than six months (LAC).

Schools are expected to make the best use of this funding to implement sustainable strategies that will quickly bring about changes for learners eligible for free school meals or who are LAC.

As a school we have agreed the following three steps:

- to identify the target group of pupils, its characteristics and need;
- to plan interventions which make the most effective use of resources;
- to monitor and evaluate the impact of resources.

In 2017 YSGOL GYNRADD LLECHRYD was provided with a PDG allocation of £13,850.

At Ysgol Gynradd Llechryd we have a comprehensive plan, agreed and monitored to promote progress and remove barriers to learning for students eligible for this funding.

We have used the funding available to:

- enhance teaching and learning by providing programmes of support within lessons and specific focus groups;
- provide intervention and support programmes that are proven to have the greatest impact and to be sustainable, such as Mathematics, Trandep, Satpin, Reading and SULP;
- provide specific high quality training for school staff, including literacy and numeracy training;
- implement and use data tracking systems to identify learners' needs, target interventions and monitor impact;
- work in partnership with other schools, the community and other organisations, such as the University of Wales, Trinity St. David;
- develop leadership capacity to prioritise the impact on the quality of provision and outcomes;
- support learners and their families by organising literacy and numeracy workshops;

Our detailed plan which includes details in respect to how we're spending the grant is available from the school office. The Welsh Government plan to change the name of this grant to 'Pupil Development Grant' from 2017 onwards.
